Fired Up: New Vistas in Ceramics

Regional ceramic artists to be featured at the Fort Wayne Museum of Art

November 14, 2022 (Fort Wayne, IN) – The Fort Wayne Museum of Art is pleased to present *Fired Up: New Vistas in Ceramics*, an exhibition of work by contemporary ceramicists, on view December 10, 2022 - January 22, 2023.

Throughout art history, the genuine and limitless beauty of our earth has influenced the work of many creatives. Landscapes have been, and will continue to be, highly regarded by artists, given the endless inspiration offered by our natural world. Modern landscapes in art have even acquired a more unconstrained expression while daring to include architectural, cultural, industrial, and urban elements. This genre has also expanded its boundaries to include other mediums beyond the pioneers of painting and photography. In this exhibition, artists **Seth Green, George Morrison, Joel Pisowicz, Joseph Pelka, and Justin Rothshank** explore their version of the landscape through ceramics while showcasing their technical abilities and individualized aesthetics. Each of the artists in the exhibition are represented by the museum’s premier sales gallery, the Paradigm Gallery.

General admission to see this exhibition at the museum is free for FWMoA members, \$10 adults, \$8 students and seniors 65+, and \$25 for families. FWMoA gallery hours are Tuesday-Saturday 10-6pm, Thursdays 10-8pm, and Sundays 12-5pm.

Ottis Adams and later William Forsyth, the Fort Wayne Museum of Art has evolved into the primary resource for the visual arts in Northeast Indiana. Regularly exhibiting regional and nationally acclaimed artists, the FWMoA also boasts an extensive permanent collection of American Art, including the Steven Sorman Archives and more than 350 pieces of glass sculpture. The Museum is committed to the collection, preservation, presentation and interpretation of American and related art to engage broad and diverse audiences throughout the community and region and add value to their lives.
