

In November 2022, the Fort Wayne Museum of Art earned fieldwide professional accreditation for the third time since 1996! Accreditation is awarded by the American Alliance of Museums (AAM), the nation's largest and most visible professional affiliation group for museums. The Alliance offers professional resources, conducts research in the field, and sets standards for excellence to which museums may voluntarily aspire and seek accreditation in hitting those standards. An accredited museum must maintain such professional standards in order to keep its accreditation, which is evaluated once every ten years.

Accreditation signifies excellence to the museum community, to governments, funders, outside agencies, and to the museum-going public. The Fort Wayne Museum of Art was initially accredited in 1996, reaccredited in 2008, and reaccredited again in late 2022. Thank you to the staff, board, and community partners for participating in the 2022 accreditation process, and to our countless donors over the years whose contributions have made it possible for us to continue to operate at these high professional standards.

Alliance accreditation brings national recognition to a museum for its commitment to excellence, accountability, high professional standards, and continued institutional improvement. Developed and sustained by museum professionals for 50 years, the Alliance's museum accreditation program is the field's primary vehicle for quality assurance, self-regulation and public accountability. It strengthens the museum profession by promoting practices that enable leaders to make informed decisions, allocate resources wisely, and remain financially and ethically accountable in order to provide the best possible service to the public.



Exhibitions

The Glass Wing at the Fort Wayne Museum of Art

Over the past decade, the Fort Wayne Museum of Art has built one of the fastest growing collections of Studio Glass in the Midwest. A new permanent glass wing showcases a selection of our rapidly expanding collection of almost 400 glass sculptures. As visitors tour the galleries, they encounter a vast array of dazzling glass art and learn about Studio Glass's development from the mid-20th century to today. The first exhibitions in this new space was Heating Up: New Glass Acquisitions and Broad Spectrum, Clear Vision: The Collection of Carl and Stephanie Beling, from July 16 through October 16, 2022.

Our collection has been built by donors, collectors, and the artists themselves who gave generously to aid in this pursuit. These exhibitions presented a selection of glass acquired by the museum through donation and purchase over the past year.

This exhibition debuted a curated selection of the extensive collection of contemporary glass sculptures that Drs. Carl and Stephanie Beling acquired over the course of a three-decade long adventure in collecting. In addition to collecting glass, Carl, under the tutelage of renowned glass artist Bertil Vallien, became an accomplished glass artist himself. In 2021, Stephanie Beling donated their entire collection of 188 works to the Fort Wayne Museum of Art to enhance our efforts to create a world-class center for contemporary glass sculpture.

What we're most proud of this year: Exhibitions

Handstitched Worlds: The Cartography of Quilts | June 18 - September 11, 2022

This exhibition asked viewers to read quilts as maps, tracing the paths of individual stories and experiences that illuminate larger historical events and cultural trends. The quilts were presented as extensions of the hands, bodies, minds, and spirits that constructed them—each artwork constituting a unique site of meaning that embodies the artist's identity, memories, and intentions. Like a roadmap, quilts direct us to their place of origin. To further explore these cartographies, these quilts were exhibited adjacent to Jerry Gretzinger's visionary mapping project, Jerry's Map (1963–ongoing). These quilts provide comfort and a sense of safety; they make the unknown known, or the unknown home. Handstitched Worlds: The Cartography of Quilts was organized by the American Folk Art Museum, New York and is toured by International Arts & Artists, Washington, D.C.





Bill Blass: Fort Wayne's Fashion Designer June 22-September 18, 2022

In honor of his 100th birthday, the Fort Wayne Museum of Art presented an exhibition of the original designs of Bill Blass, Fort Wayne's very own fashion designer. Born and raised in Fort Wayne, Blass' signature simple yet striking designs are distinctly American and tied to his upbringing in the relaxed and conservative Midwest. The son of a dressmaker, Blass grew up sketching in his modest home on Calhoun Street and taking classes at the Fort Wayne Art School. This first-ever exhibition of Blass' designs in Fort Wayne took viewers on a journey of his career from the 1950s to the 2000s, with loans from the Sage Collection at Indiana University and significant contributions from the Bill Blass Legacy Team spearheaded by Kathy Carrier. The exhibition was presented in partnership with the History Center, whose exhibition focused on Blass' youth in Fort Wayne, his military achievements in the Ghost Army, and his contributions to marketing and branding.





Susan Janow: If I Were a Queen September 3 – December 4, 2022

Since 2003, Susan Janow has practiced at Creative Growth Art Center, a non-profit organization based in Oakland, California that advances the inclusion of artists with developmental disabilities in contemporary art and strengthens community by providing a supportive studio environment and gallery representation. She approaches her drawings with a methodical and meditative focus. Beginning with an open hand-drawn grid, she meticulously fills in each shape with fine lines that resemble faintly moving curtains when complete. This process of intensive crosshatching is precise and introspective, as Janow works with unbroken focus. A multimedia artist, Janow's practice is expansive. She works with ink, ceramic, collage, wood, and textile, and she is widely recognized for her video work, Janow writes, directs, and often stars in her own short films. Her seminal work "Questions?" is in the permanent collection at the Brooklyn Museum and her work on paper is in the permanent collection of the Centre Pompidou.



The National: Best Contemporary Photography 2022 September 17, 2022 - January 8, 2023

This hybrid invitational and juried exhibition was anchored by photography standouts Melanie Walker, Raymond Thompson Jr., Morgan Barrie, Jack Sharkey, Karen Klinedinst, Ian van Coller, and Jeanette May, as well as the work of emerging talented artists from across the country pushing the boundaries of the medium with adventurous techniques and original subject matter.



Breathing Life Into History: Contemporary Native American Art from the Collection November 19, 2022 - January 29, 2023

Pulling from traditions passed down from generation to generation, contemporary Native American artists, especially in the last quarter century, have produced an impressive body of work in diverse media. Unique in their dual-identity, living in the present day but integrating ancient cultural and spiritual ideas, the featured artists' abilities to either weave their heritage into contemporary contexts through medium and imagery, or continue using traditional methods in a modern world, speaks to their self-expression, Influences seen throughout the works include textiles, nature, rituals and storytelling, and identity and politics. Indigenous artists continue to create with their cultural knowledge, reinterpret tradition, and engage with current topics. Artists in this exhibition included mixed-media artist Jeffrey Gibson, master printmaker Jaune Quick-to-See Smith, glass sculptor Tony Jojola, and ceramicist Maria Martinez.







Fired Up: New Vistas in Ceramics December 10, 2022 - January 29, 2023

Throughout art history, the genuine and limitless beauty of our earth has influenced the work of many creatives. Over time, landscapes have become more unconstrained in their expression, moving away from pure vistas to include architectural, cultural, industrial, and urban elements. This genre has also expanded its boundaries beyond its original roots in painting and photography. In this exhibition, regional artists Seth Green, George Morrison, Joseph Pelka, Joel Pisowicz, and Justin Rothshank explored their version of the landscape through ceramics, showcasing their technical abilities

and individualized aesthetics. By creating work about the earth from the earth, they add dimension and perspective to the timeless conversation between artist and landscape. Each of these artists is represented by the FWMoA Paradigm Gallery, our premier sales gallery featuring the work of artists from the region.

Indiana Waterways: The Art of Conservation

January 14 - March 19, 2023

The Indiana Waterways project is the innovation of five Hoosier artists, to capturein art and words-the growing urgency of environmental inattention. This traveling exhibition, an accompanying 200-plus page art book featuring 100 paintings, along with community forums and civic discussions in underserved communities, built awareness of the need for increased conservation and restoration. The project strives to set a scholarly standard through deep analysis, creative reflection, and historical insight of indigenous and other ethnic communities along Indiana waterways. The artists, John Kelty, Curt Stanfield, Avon Waters, and brothers Dan and Tom Woodson, often painted the same waterways, but each found different inspiration and results using three different mediums; oil, watercolor, and pastel, The multi-year painting project was funded by grants from the Indiana Arts Commission, Indiana Humanities, Izaak Walton League of America - Indiana Division Foundation, and contributions by more than 100 individuals through the non-profit Art Nature Consortium. After its Fall 2022 debut in Indianapolis and its early 2023 showing in Fort Wayne, the exhibition will tour other venues until its close in December 2023 at the Hoosier Salon in New Harmony, Indiana.





Art Deco Glass from the David Huchthausen Collection April 1 - August 6, 2023

For many decades, glass artist and collector David Huchthausen has collected with a keen and practiced eye. The quality and depth of his collection would be difficult, if not impossible, to replicate. His collecting history began with the first pieces acquired while working as a graduate assistant to Harvey Littleton and continues today. This exhibition revealed this unique collection of over 120 Art Deco glass works, which included many major studios and artists of the period (René Lalique, Steuben Glass Works, Daum Nancy, and Pierre D'Avesn) concurrent with our permanent collection of contemporary glass.

Eyes on Education

The Scholastic Art & Writing Awards remains one of our most meaningful programs for creative teens to earn recognition and enjoy the exhibition of their award-winning art and writing at the Fort Wayne Museum of Art. In 2023, 2,831 works of art and writing were submitted for competition by 1,311 teens across Northern Indiana and

Northwest Ohio, with 963 students earning Honorable Mention, Silver Key, or Gold Key. Thirty national medals were awarded to local students whose Gold Keys qualified them for competition on the national stage.







The FWMoA Teen Council is led by and for area youth, providing opportunities for leadership and learning through arts programming. As ambassadors of the Museum, council members work collaboratively with staff to develop creative, community-oriented projects and events. The Teen Council of 2022 spent Chalk Walk refreshing the colorful crosswalk between our building and the Arts United Center. The students also have been working to increase awareness of the program throughout their various schools, designing and hand printing promotional posters.



Museum education staff include the Allen County Juvenile Center in its outreach visits through Gallery on Wheels. Students at ACJC benefit from being included in our Indiana standards-based arts programming, aiding in their rehabilitation and preparation for productive civic participation.

Looking to the Community



Our favorite event of the summer, the 2023 Chalk Walk, took place on July 8 and 9! Artists loved the category "Alice In Wonderland" and were challenged by the "Van Gogh in Fort Wayne." Although a heavy downpour Saturday morning meant any prep work the night before was washed away, our community rallied to fill the street with color and life! The annual **Día de los Muertos** celebration at FWMoA was back to full event status in the fall of 2022! A series of artist and family-made altars filled a FWMoA gallery, often honoring deceased loved ones or groups of individuals who have died for a cause or as a result of persecution or injustice. A celebration hosted in November featured traditional dancing, children's activities, mariachi, folkloric characters, and complimentary baked goods!

We expanded our accessible programming this year with educator-led tours open to all that explore current exhibitions with in-depth discussion of selected artworks. On select Second Saturdays, family-friendly tours include interpretation in American Sign Language provided by DeafLink. We continue to offer bilingual tours in both Spanish and English every other month!





Print Room Talks are designed to make a major part of our collection, works on paper, accessible to the public through the expert guidance of our Curator of Prints and Drawings, Sachi Yanari-Rizzo. This series allows participants to view and learn from works on paper—unframed and without a glass barrier—with an intimate learning experience through curated collection themes, such as screenprinting, lithography, and etching.

FWMoA is now affiliated with the Children's Museum of Indianapolis Access Pass. Indiana families enrolled in government benefit programs can apply for the Access Pass. Access Pass holders receive discounted admission at a variety of Indiana cultural institutions, including FWMoA. This special partnership makes enjoying FWMoA more accessible for low-income families. The Access Pass partnership adds to our admission programs for low-income families, which already include Museums for All, which reduces admission for nationwide visitors receiving government benefits, Free admission for military families and veterans, and Free Thursday evenings for everyone.
